Michele Owen Losing My Place

JANUARY 22 - 31, 2021

'This exhibition is a love letter to Victoria and a small tribute to the huge sacrifices that were made by Melburnians in 2020.'

Losing My Place is a series of small oil paintings commenced during, and in response to, my experience of Melbourne's strict stage 4 lockdown. For several months Melbourne and regional Victoria were separated by a 'Ring of Steel' and Melbourne residents were restricted to a 5km radius of their homes. In a time when issues of division, isolation, loss, grief and mental health prevailed in my city, I reflected on the importance of regional and rural places to reinvigorate us and restore our wellbeing.

These paintings are a recollection of memories of the places that enliven me. Places I love and longed to visit again at a time when no-one knew when that would be possible. A series of fleeting moments of picnic spots, country drives, holidays and day trips recalled from a lifetime of experiences in the Victorian countryside. These small works created a tiny lens to explore the spaciousness, glowing light and energetic hum of the Victorian landscape.

Hilly Around Here, Cottlesbridge was inspired by the charming hilly district of Cottlesbridge which is dotted with small farms and boutique wineries, not far from my home in Wattle Glen but beyond our 5km lockdown radius.




A Picnic Spot Near Macedon
